

Open Access Terminology Guide


<i>Term</i>	<i>Description</i>
Open Access (OA)	OA is the free and unrestricted availability of full-text research material on the internet, allowing users to access research with no barriers.
Gold OA; also known as paid OA (incl. APCs, hybrid and pure Gold journals)	A Gold OA article is made freely available in its final version immediately upon online publication. Publishers charge a fee, the Article Processing Charge, to the author or institution (APC). In hybrid journals an author can choose between the 'traditional' method of publishing articles or making the individual article Gold OA. A pure Gold Journal only contains Open Access articles.
Green OA; also known as self-archiving	A version of the output (usually the post-print, i.e. accepted manuscript) is stored in an institutional repository (e.g. ORCA) and/or a subject-based repository (e.g. ArXiv , PubMed Central). Often an embargo is required by the publisher.
Embargo	Some publishers have restrictions on when the author version of an article can be made publically available. This varies, dependent on the journal. If research is funded or to be submitted to the REF, maximum compliant embargo periods apply.
Pre-print	See Article Versions Guide overleaf.
Post-print	See Article Versions Guide overleaf.
Creative Commons	A non-profit organisation which makes available licences to support the sharing and re-use of knowledge and research. The least restrictive is the CC-BY licence, allowing authors to share, copy, distribute, transmit, and remix a work as long as the work is attributed. This is the licence that funders require when making your work Gold OA. See http://creativecommons.org/ for further details.
RCUK	RCUK includes AHRC, BBSRC, EPSRC, ESRC, MRC, NERC & STFC which all mandate Open Access. See https://intranet.cardiff.ac.uk/staff/research-support/open-access/open-access-publishing/gold-oa/rcuk-fund .
Wellcome Trust / COAF	A partnership between the Wellcome Trust, Arthritis Research UK, Bloodwise, British Heart Foundation, Cancer Research UK and Parkinson's UK which mandates Open Access. Article Versions Guide

The difference between pre-print, post-print and publisher's pdf:

	Also known as	Definition
Pre-print	Draft; Submitted manuscript	Submitted version of a research article, prior to peer review.
Post-print	Author Accepted manuscript	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Final, corrected and peer-reviewed version of the article, without the publisher's branding. Version compliant with funders such as REF, RCUK and Wellcome Trust. Please save the file as a pdf before depositing in ORCA. Authors can make any necessary corrections and integrate figures and tables into the accepted manuscript if they wish to. Please note that the publisher's proof is already copyrighted and does not count as a post-print.
Publisher's pdf	Final version; Proofs; Version of record	The type-set and formatted version of the article as it appears online or in the print journal (including the proofs).



Mynediad Agored (OA)	Mae Mynediad Agored yn golygu bod testun deunydd ymchwil ar gael yn llawn ac yn ddirwystr i ddefnyddwyr ar y we.
Mynediad Agored Aur; neu Fynediad Agored a delir (gan gynnwys Cost Prosesu'r Erthygl, cyfnodolion cymysg a chyfnodolion Aur pur)	Mae erthygl Mynediad Agored Aur ar gael yn rhad ac am ddim ar ffurf ei fersiwn derfynol yn syth ar ôl ei chyhoeddi ar-lein. Mae cyhoeddwyr yn codi Ffi Prosesu'r Erthygl (APC) ar yr awdur neu'r sefydliad. Mewn cylchgronau cymysg, gall awdur naill ai gyhoeddi erthyglau yn y dull 'traddodiadol' neu roi Mynediad Agored Aur i erthygl benodol. Dim ond erthyglau Mynediad Agored sydd mewn Cyfnodolyn Aur pur.
Mynediad Agored Gwyrdd; neu hunan-archifo	Caiff fersiwn o'r allbwn (fel arfer y fersiwn ôl-argraffu h.y. llawysgrif derbyn) ei chadw mewn storfa sefydliadol (e.e. ORCA) a/neu storfa sy'n seiliedig ar bwnc (e.e. ArXiv , PubMed Central). Yn aml, bydd yn ofynnol cael embargo gan y cyhoeddwr.
Embargo	Mae gan rai cyhoeddwyr gyfyngiadau o ran pryd y gellir cyhoeddi fersiwn yr awdur o erthygl. Mae hyn yn amrywio, gan ddibynnu ar y cyfnodolyn. Os oes ymchwil wedi'i hariannu neu am gael ei chyflwyno i'r REF, bydd rhaid cydymffurfio â'r cyfnodau embargo hiraf.
Cyn-argraffu	Gweler yr Arweiniad am Fersiynau Erthyglau dros y dudalen.
Ôl-argraffu	Gweler yr Arweiniad am Fersiynau Erthyglau dros y dudalen.
Comin Creu (Creative Commons)	Sefydliad di-elw sy'n cynnig trwyddedau er mwyn rhannu ac ailddefnyddio gwybodaeth ac ymchwil. Y drwydded CC-BY yw'r un lleiaf cyfyngol gan ei bod yn galluogi awduron i rannu, copio, dosbarthu, trosglwyddo ac ailgymysgu gwaith ar yr amod eu bod yn priodoli'r gwaith. Dyma'r drwydded sydd ei hangen ar gyllidwyr wrth gyflwyno eu gwaith ar Fynediad Agored Aur. Cewch ragor o fanylion yn http://creativecommons.org/ .

Ôl-argraffu	Llawysgrif wedi'i derbyn gan yr awdur	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fersiwn derfynol, gywir ac wedi'i hadolygu gan gymheiriad o'r erthygl, heb frand y cyhoeddwr. Fersiwn sy'n cydymffurfio â chyllidwyr fel REF, RCUK ac Ymddiriedolaeth Wellcome. Cadwch y ffeil fel pdf cyn ei gyflwyno yn ORCA. Gall awduron wneud unrhyw newidiadau angenrheidiol ac integreiddio ffigyrâu a thablau yn y llawysgrif sydd wedi'i derbyn. Sylwer y bydd hawlfraint ar broflen y cyhoeddwr eisoes ac ni chaiff ei hystyried fel fersiwn ar ôl argraffu.
Pdf y cyhoeddwr	Fersiwn derfynol; Profleini; Fersiwn o'r cofnod	Cysodiad a fersiwn wedi'i fformatio o'r erthygl fel mae'n edrych ar-lein neu yn y cyfnodolyn a argraffwyd (gan gynnwys y profleini).
