


Dr Stuart Lowe from LCOGT talks to schoolchildren from all over Wales about revealing the invisible: infrared light at the Big Bang Cymru Fair.



In 2011 we reached 6.3 million people through popular talks, newspaper articles, TV, magazine articles, radio, exhibitions and schools talks.



The "audience" numbers are dominated by TV and radio shows including The Today Programme and Sky at Night. Interestingly, we saw staff choosing more diverse outreach activities and audiences.
